WANSC FOOD SHELF FUND



2023 Expansion to Waseca Area Food Shelf

"Long after I'm gone I want to make an impact on this community." This simple thought process, yet so impactful, is what led a longtime Waseca resident, who wishes to remain anonymous, to establish a fund within the Waseca Area Foundation (WAF). The Waseca Area Neighborhood Service Center (WANSC) Food Shelf Fund was established in 2022, and now it will annually distribute a grant from this fund to the WANSC Food Shelf.


Our community has a variety of needs; however, this individual has always tried to support the local food shelf in whatever way he/she could throughout the years. "The simple needs of air, water, and food will always be there. I know I can't do much

about the air or water in my lifetime, but I can do something about the food supply," stated the donor. Food insecurity has always been a concern, and it certainly doesn't seem to be a dying need, so thinking long term how one could make an impact on a large population, this is a natural fit for this particular donor.

This is the first fund created in the WAF Family of Funds that is designated strictly to support food insecurity in our county. The donor hopes that fellow Waseca County residents, and beyond, will also share in the desire to support this cause and donate to this fund over time. As the fund grows, the money granted to the WANSC food shelf will grow, and in turn, the food insecurity concerns in our County will decline. The generosity of this donor will have a positive impact for years to come – providing food for those in need.

UNRESTRICTED FUND Through a gift to our **Unrestricted Fund**, donors are helping to ensure there will be resources tomorrow for needs we can't even imagine today. RESTRICTED FUND Through a **Restricted Fund**, donors establish a fund that will support the work of the Waseca Area Foundation while establishing specific guidelines for how the grants will be distributed based on the donor wishes.

DONOR ADVISED FUND Through a **Donor Advised Fund**, you can have a voice in your philanthropy and receive benefits similar to a personal or family foundation without the administrative responsibilities. Donor Advised Funds are convenient, flexible tools for individuals, families or businesses that want to be personally involved in recommending grants made possible by their gifts. If you have a range of community interests, you may find that a Donor Advised Fund is an ideal vehicle for fulfilling your charitable wishes.

DESIGNATED FUND Through a Designated Fund, you create an enduring source of support for specific organizations and programs you care about. You choose the projects or purposes to benefit from your generosity, and we invest and distribute funds in the form of grants.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND Through a Scholarship Fund, you create a legacy of helping individuals achieve their potential by supporting their educational goals. You have the ability to establish a Scholarship Fund to benefit students of a particular school, geographic region, educational discipline or other designation.

SUSTAINING PARTNERS PROGRAM

JANESVILLE AREA FOUNDATION FUND

ANNUAL LETTER

The Janesville Area Foundation had another banner year in 2022. This past year our organization decided to continue under the Waseca Area Foundation umbrella as they became their own non profit 501c3 organization. The Waseca Area Foundation will continue to provide operational support for the Janesville Area Foundation as they have in the past. This does not change anything about how we operate or the mission and goals of the Janesville Area Foundation of raising dollars to provide grants to worthwhile Janesville Area nonprofits.

In July we celebrated our 10th year anniversary with a BIG "Yellowstone" themed celebration in Janesville. The evening was full of fellowship and fun while providing education about the local Foundation and thanking the community for its past support. Hats and western wear were seen in abundance with dinner, raffles, auctions, and trivia contests all a part of the evening. Our newest board member, Joe Burke, did a great job emceeing and entertaining those in attendance. The event was well received and although not intended as a fundraiser as much as a celebration, we did raise over \$11,000 that evening.

The past year was our third annual February "I Love JAF" campaign. In 2021 we raised \$15,000 and this year we exceeded our goal raising almost \$22,000. The purpose of this project each year, in addition to growing our fund, is to increase community awareness of the Janesville Area Foundation and the grants that we award annually out of the fund's earnings.

The highlight this past year, as always, was the November annual grant awards program. We awarded 11 grants totaling \$12,371 ranging from \$200 to \$3,000. In addition, this year the EF Johnson Foundation as part of the Waseca Area Foundation funded an additional 4 requests totaling \$10,177. All of these grants were awarded to deserving Janesville area projects. Each year during the awards program the grant recipients get a chance to talk about their organization and the project being funded, which is very exciting for all in attendance. We hope to be able to increase our grant awards in future years as our Janesville fund continues to grow.

We are grateful to have new Board members, Joe Burke and Bridget Gehring, who joined our Board this past year. 

WASECA CAREGIVER SERVICES

Waseca Area Caregiver Services (WACS)

was established in 2013 and incorporated in 2016. Kelly Boeddeker, Executive Director of WACS, works with volunteer board members and volunteers to carry out caregiver support activities of the organization. Some Time Away (STA), a weekly social group respite program, is facilitated in our building. STA is targeted to those with mild to moderate memory loss and those older adults who are socially isolated and spend most of their time alone.

Due to a generous grant from the Waseca Area Foundation, a much-needed wheelchair ramp was installed in 2022, providing handicap accessibility to our mobility impaired clients. In addition to the ramp, and with the assistance of grant funds from the foundation, WACS is able to offer STA 2 days a week. On Mondays and Wednesdays participants, volunteers, and staff gather from 10:00 until 2:00 to enjoy a time of social gathering, fun activities, food, and exercises offered at the Sometime Away program. Caregivers are provided with a much-needed break from their caregiving responsibilities. Caregivers have commented on how valuable this time away is. The following statements have been made by caregivers:

"I'm going home to take a nap!" "I can go get my oil changed." "Can I drop her off 10 minutes early so I can get to my doctor appointment on time?" "I can go get groceries." "I'm so happy to get a break!" "I can go get my hair cut."

The Waseca Area Foundation has also provided grant support for our Caring Hands program. This service provides chore and homemaker services. The Caring Hands program was

developed in November of 2020 to connect volunteers with aging adults to assist with homemaker and chore support. WACS is the only organization in Waseca County providing these services for aging adults. In addition, the WACS has developed a service that provides support to aging homeowners where we help in removing unneeded items from their current home or assist with downsizing from their current home to a more manageable living

"I appreciate the organizational support and the motivation to continue to keep my home uncluttered and free from fall hazards." "I appreciated the consultation with Kelly about how to relocate to Waseca and access services and educate ourselves and our family on how best to support us with as independent as possible as we age." "I appreciate being able to visit with someone while receiving assistance with completing homemaker and chores as we work together." "It is such a blessing to have someone come in, help me make a grocery list and pick up groceries for me. I enjoy the time we spend together as the volunteer helps me put groceries away and the friendly visiting." "It's been helpful to have someone help me schedule transportation medical appointments as I am hard of hearing."

The goal of having our concert series is to bring in diverse genres of music for our community at an affordable cost. We have had the pleasure of presenting Mill City Jazz, Jivin Ivan, The Wild Goose Chase Cloggers, Pat Donohue & Ron Arsenault, and The Benson Family Singers. We look forward to hosting other talented groups for our community to enjoy.

In 2022 we partnered with the Waseca County Historical Society to hold Lakefest. The Waseca Art Center was tasked with finding activities for community members to enjoy while the playground equipment was being renovated. With a grant from the Waseca Area Foundation, we were able to hire the talents of Puppet Farm Studios to teach and entertain. The studio assisted attendees in making a craft project from recyclable materials. They also had a huge wolf puppet that danced around to the live music and interacted with the kids at the event.

The most recent grant has helped the Waseca Art Center to set up our own ceramics studio. The funds were used to hire an electrician to install drop-down outlets for the pottery wheels and install an outlet for the kiln and exhaust vent. We will be offering ceramics classes to the public soon, so keep an eye out for further developments on our website and on Facebook. We believe that the ceramics studio and classes will increase our reach in the community, and attract more people of all ages to the Art Center.


